Preparing for God's 'Suddenlies' in this Season

Isaiah 48:3 "I have declared the former things from the beginning... **Suddenly** I did them, and they came to pass."

Isaiah 60:1–2 "Arise, shine; for your light has come... For behold, **darkness** shall cover the earth... **but the LORD will arise over you**, and His glory will be seen upon you."

Acts 2:2 "And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind..."

Boot Camp

We are being prepared for a season in which God's **suddenlies** accelerate, not diminish. The Church is crossing from occasional visitation to **sustained habitation**. The call is simple and urgent: **persevere**, **stand fast** on His promises, and **expect** divine interruptions that reveal His glory in undeniable ways. In Christ, **there shall be no ebb**.

The Prophetic Thread We're Standing In **A word carried across generations**. In the 1930s, a prophetic utterance—later cherished by Arthur Burt—spoke of a move that would arrive as a **breath**, become a **wind**, gather as **rain**, and overflow as **floods**—with this hallmark: "There shall be no ebb."

What the sequence means for now:

Breath — (חור Ruach) consecration, repentance, first-love devotion.

Wind — (חור Ruach) mobilization of ordinary believers, bold witness, house-to-house strength.

Rain — weighty presence, Scripture-soaked prayer, steady transformation.

Floods — harvest, reconciliation, and creative miracles that cannot be contained.

The appointed time. "The vision is yet for an appointed time... though it tarry, wait for it; because it will surely come." (Hab. 2:3) Waiting has not been wasted; it has refined our focus and forged our endurance for what now unfolds.

Signs of the Rising Tide

Campus awakenings. In recent years, universities have seen spontaneous prayer, repentance, and prolonged worship. Asbury's 2023 outpouring became a signpost that **student hunger** can reset the Church's expectations.

Waters of baptism. Coastlines and lakes have become altars; *thousands have been baptized* in public spaces, a visible declaration that the Gospel is not retreating but advancing.

Home altars rekindled. While some congregations struggled, house fellowships multiplied. Around kitchen tables and living rooms, the Word and the Spirit have fueled resilient communities of faith.

A costly witness, a sober hour. On September 10, 2025, the assassination of Charlie Kirk while

addressing students shocked the nation. The tragedy provoked grief, prayer, and a renewed resolve—especially among young adults—to cling to Christ and to Scripture in public.

A hunger for the Word. In the weeks that followed, Bible reading and Bible sales rose significantly. Many who were spiritually indifferent found themselves searching the Scriptures again, seeking answers in the only Word that does not fail.

A clear warning, not to fear but to stand. Faithful prophetic voices have echoed a sober theme: pressure will increase, but grace will abound; persecution will rise, but boldness without bitterness will rise higher.

John 12:23–24 — "The time has come for the Son of Man to be glorified... Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies... if it dies, it **produces many** and yields a rich harvest."

Genesis 50:20 — "You meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring about that many people should be kept alive."

Interpretation: When the enemy attempts to silence Gospel witness, the Lord turns loss into multiplication. What is sown in tears returns in a harvest of joy.

Prophetic Insight for 2026

1) No Ebb—Only Flow.

The river will not retreat. Momentum will compound where integrity, humility, and Scripture are central. Avoid chasing novelty; make room for steady obedience, and you will ride the long swell of His presence

2) Breath \rightarrow Wind \rightarrow Rain \rightarrow Floods Operationalized).

Breath (Consecration): Deep repentance. Recover the fear of the Lord. Close compromise gaps.

Wind (Mobilization): Train every believer to pray the Gospel, share the Gospel, and demonstrate the Gospel.

Rain (Sustained Presence): Build weekly rhythms of worship and Scripture that don't depend on sensational moments.

Floods (Harvest & Miracles): Expect unusual

restorations—body, soul, spirit—and rapid baptisms. Prepare to *disciple* as quickly as you *evangelize*.

3) Word + Spirit Together.

Power without the Word produces drift; Word without power produces drought. The coming months call for *orthodoxy with expectancy*—Bible-open, Spirit-led.

4) House-to-House + Campus-to-Campus.

Homes and dorm rooms will function as upper rooms. Expect youth-led prayer chains, student-run debate nights marked by conviction and civility, and faculty who quietly shepherd.

5) Courage Under Pressure.

Do not be surprised by increased hostility. Expect Daniel-like faithfulness and Esther-like assignment. The command is not to rage but to **stand**—clean hands, clear eyes, warm hearts.

6) Holy Compassion Beside Holy Fire.

The outpouring will pair *creative miracles* with *works of mercy*—foster and adoption care, recovery and counseling, food and housing initiatives, refugee support. The Kingdom does not separate *power* from *character*.

Field Notes for Watchmen & Intercessors

Cling to the horns of the altar. Prayer is the first work, not the last resort.

Refuse the Laodicean Iull. Lukewarmness suffocates revival; rekindle first love daily.

Discern the noise. Don't amplify rumor or rage. Cling to Christ and tested truth.

Stay small before a big God. Humility is how we carry holy fire without smoke.

Shepherd the "long" more than the "loud". God often moves quietly before He moves publicly.

2026 Call to Action — "26 for '26" Kingdom Challenge

A simple, measurable rule of life for the next twelve months. Suggestions to fan YOUR FLAME: Daily (Personal)

26 *minutes with the Lord* (Scripture + listening prayer). Recommended readings: Isaiah 60; Isaiah 48; Acts 1–4; Habakkuk; John 12; Psalm 27.

One intentional witness (share a testimony, pray for someone, or start a Gospel conversation).

Micro-fast rhythm (one meal/day or two days/week) to keep appetites aligned with assignment.

Weekly (Household/Team)

Table Night (shared meal, communion, intercession).

2 hours of outreach (campus, workplace, neighborhood).

Baptisms on standby (water ready, towels ready, testimony team ready).

Monthly (Church/Network)

Upper Room Night (3–4 hours of worship and intercession; rotate youth leadership).

Compassion Project (serve 26 households per quarter: seniors, single parents, refugees, recovering neighbors).

Bible Basics (host "How to Read the Bible" labs; distribute physical Bibles and reading plans).

Quarterly (City/Region)

Campus-to-City Gatherings (link student prayer hubs with local congregations).

Healing & Freedom Clinics (trained teams for prayer, trauma care, addiction recovery, and practical helps).

Unity Fast (3 days) across multiple churches for holiness, harvest, and justice.

Watchmen's Checklist (Bullet Essentials)

Anchor Texts (2026): Isaiah 48:3; Isaiah 60:1–2; Acts 2:1–4; Habakkuk 2:1–3; John 12:23–24; Psalm 110; Revelation 3:14–22.

Three Non-Negotiables: Holiness, Honesty, Honor.

Guardrails:

Test all prophetic words (1 Cor. 14).

Submit to Scripture and healthy accountability.

Keep accounts clean—money, media, motives.

Capture testimonies with integrity; avoid exaggeration.

Metrics that Matter (track monthly):

Salvations, baptisms, and Bible engagement (plans completed).

New house-churches or prayer rooms launched.

Campus touchpoints (clubs engaged, weekly prayer counts).

Compassion impact (households served, meals provided, counseling hours).

Documented healings, reconciliations, and freedom testimonies.

A 2026 Ministry Playbook (Leaders' Edition)

1) Forty Days to Arise (Suggested: Jan 1–Feb 9, 2026)

Dawn prayer (15–30 minutes): proclaim Isaiah 60 over your home, church, and city.

Midday Scripture (10–15 minutes): read the Gospels aloud; journal one obedience step.

Evening family altar (10–20 minutes): thanksgiving, testimony, and intercession.

Weekly fast and neighborhood blessing walk; pray for homes by name and need.

Deliverables:

A simple *testimony capture* form. Suggested: https://www.unitedhive.com/

A *baptism readiness* kit (pool/tank access, towels, volunteers, follow-up plan).

A **Scripture plan** (print + audio QR) for seekers and new believers.

2) Word-Centered Discipleship Launch **Gospel + Acts** reading tracks with weekly meetups.

Train every small group in $Read \rightarrow Obey \rightarrow Share$ (what did we hear? how will we obey this week? who will we bless?).

Place **Bible access** at the center: print Bibles, audio links, plans for new believers and kids.

3) Campus Coalitions (Spring & Fall Terms) Adopt a campus (college, high school, trade school).

Form three teams: Prayer, Reasoned Witness (Q&A / debate nights), and Mercy (service projects).

Host two Courage Nights per semester (testimony + open Q&A framed by Scripture and civility).
4) Baptism Windows

Synchronize with regional momentum (e.g., Pente-

cost or late summer).

Offer *monthly* baptism opportunities — *not* quarterly.

Always pair baptism with *immediate discipleship* on-ramps.

5) Mercy & Justice On-Ramps Quarterly *Love-Your-City* projects (foster/adoption support, recovery partnerships, food security, school support).

Pair *healing rooms* with *help rooms* (prayer + practical aid).

6) Healthy Prophetic Culture Teach *edification, exhortation, comfort* (1 Cor. 14).

Practice **weighing and accountability**; avoid celebrity culture.

Model **bold humility**—"we see in part"—and steward testimonies carefully.

7) Leadership Rhythms Quarterly *Upper Room Weekends* (Fri night–Sat noon) for pastors and intercessors—worship, intercession, Scripture, listening.

Data with discernment: Track outcomes to **shep-herd**, not to boast. Use numbers to serve people, not to impress them.

Prayer Points (With Scripture) **Awakening & Courage** — "Arise, shine... the LORD will arise over you." (Isa. 60:1–2)

God's Suddenlies — "Suddenly I did them, and they came to pass." (Isa. 48:3)

Upper Room Fire — "Suddenly a sound from heaven..." (Acts 2:2)

Harvest Through Surrender — "If it dies, it produces many." (John 12:24)

Redemption of Evil — "You meant evil... God meant it for good." (Gen. 50:20)

Perseverance & Purity — "Be faithful unto death... overcome." (Rev. 2–3 themes)

Pray like this:

"Lord, breathe on Your Church again: **consecrate** us, **mobilize** us, **drench** us, and **send** us."

"Make our homes and campuses upper rooms. Let Your Word run swiftly and be glorified."

"Give us boldness without bitterness, courage without cruelty, zeal without pride."

Declarations for 2026

We **arise and shine**; the glory of the LORD is upon us.

We welcome **God's suddenlies** and align with His appointed times.

We refuse the **Laodicean Iull**; we burn with first love.

We expect a *rich harvest*—salvations, reconciliations, and creative miracles.

We proclaim that what the enemy meant for evil, *God turns for good* to keep many alive.

Over our homes, churches, and cities we decree: *There shall be no ebb*.

Pastoral Note on 2025's Shock
The September 10, 2025 assassination of Charlie
Kirk remains a grievous marker in our national
story. Our response must not be hatred but *holiness*; not panic but *prayer*; not withdrawal but
witness. If evil sought to intimidate, we answer
with repentance, resolve, and radiant hope. Let
Scripture—not social feeds—be our anchor. Let love
be our logic. Let Jesus remain our message.

The Invitation

Beloved, this is the hour to *tighten our grip* on God's promises and *lighten our grip* on everything else. Keep Jesus—the Author and Finisher of our faith—at the center. *Breathe* in the Spirit's breath, set your sails to His *wind*, rejoice in His *rain*, and make room for His *floods*. The river is rising. In Christ, *there shall be no ebb*.

Quick-Start "No Ebb" Checklist (2026) Choose your **40-day window** (e.g., Jan 1–Feb 9).

Put *Gospel + Acts* front-and-center (reading plans and weekly discussion).

Adopt a campus; form Prayer / Reasoned Witness / Mercy teams.

Schedule *monthly baptism Sundays;* recruit a testimony team.

Launch one **Love-Your-City** project each quarter.

Host *Upper Room Weekends* quarterly for leaders and intercessors.

Teach healthy *prophetic practice*; weigh words, collect testimonies.

Track outcomes (salvations, baptisms, Bible engagement, compassion touchpoints) to **shepherd well**, not to hype.



Daniel: The Power of Being Steady Under Pressure

In a world that constantly tests our convictions, the life of Daniel stands as a powerful example of what it means to remain steady under pressure. His story, recorded in the Book of Daniel, is not simply a tale of prophetic dreams or divine deliverance from lions. It is a portrait of a man who lived faithfully to God in the midst of political power, cultural opposition, and personal challenge. Daniel's steadiness—his quiet strength of faith—enabled him to navigate a life filled with demands, deception, and danger. And in doing so, he became known as the man "in whom the Spirit of God dwells."

Faithfulness in a Demanding World

Daniel's story begins with disruption. As a young man, he was taken from his homeland of Judah to Babylon after King Nebuchadnezzar's conquest. He was exiled, displaced, and placed in a rigorous program to train the brightest captives for service in the Babylonian court. Babylon was a city of brilliance and excess,

known for its wealth, art, and education—but also for its idolatry. Daniel's faith was tested immediately, not through violence, but through subtle assimilation.

He was given a new name—Belteshazzar—a name tied to Babylon's gods. He was taught Babylonian literature and language. Even his daily meals came from the king's table, rich with food that violated Jewish dietary laws. Yet Daniel's first act of resistance was not dramatic; it was steady. Scripture says, "But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself" (Daniel 1:8).

That phrase—purposed in his heart—is the key to Daniel's life. It shows a decision made long before the pressure came. His resolve wasn't loud, but it was firm. Daniel's faithfulness in small things—like his diet—was the foundation for his faithfulness in great things. He set boundaries early, choosing devotion to God over convenience or comfort. In a world filled with demands and distractions, Daniel's steady purpose reminds us that spiritual strength grows from daily decisions to honor God in the ordinary routines of life.

Standing Firm in a Culture of Compromise

As Daniel rose in prominence, serving under multiple kings and empires, the tension between his faith and the culture around him deepened. Babylon—and later Persia—were societies that valued wisdom, influence, and power. Daniel possessed all three, but he never allowed those qualities to eclipse his faith.

When Nebuchadnezzar dreamed troubling dreams, Daniel didn't claim human insight. He humbly said, "There is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries" (Daniel 2:28). His influence grew not through ambition but through integrity and dependence on God. Each time the kings sought answers, Daniel pointed beyond himself to the Source of all wisdom.

Living in a culture that did not share his beliefs required both courage and discernment. Daniel learned to serve without surrender. He worked with excellence in a pagan system, yet his loyalty remained to God alone. He did not isolate himself, but he did not conform either. This balance—faithfully engaging with culture while resisting its idols—is one of the greatest challenges believers face today. Daniel's life shows that it is possible to live faithfully in the world without being shaped by it.

Yet, in a profound way, the culture around Daniel also helped shape him. Babylon's pressures refined his faith. Each test became a tool God used to strengthen his witness. The wisdom and poise Daniel gained through years of service in foreign courts would later become his platform for revealing the glory of God. The culture that tried to change him instead became the setting that displayed the Spirit of God within him.

Integrity in the Face of Deception

Daniel's steady faith also faced opposition from within his own workplace. His success under King Darius provoked jealousy among other officials, who schemed to destroy him. Unable to find fault in his work, they attacked his faith. They convinced the king to sign a decree forbidding prayer to anyone except the king himself—knowing Daniel would never compromise his devotion to God.

Again, Daniel's response was steady and consistent: "When Daniel learned that the decree had been published, he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he got down on his knees and prayed, giving thanks to his God, just as he had done before" (Daniel 6:10).

Just as he had done before. Those words reveal the secret of Daniel's strength. He didn't suddenly find courage because of a crisis; he was simply continuing a rhythm of devotion already established. Prayer was not his last resort—it was his lifestyle.

Even when deception surrounded him, Daniel stayed true to what he knew was right. His accusers sought to trap him, but Daniel trusted God with the outcome. The lions' den, meant to destroy him, became the stage for God's deliverance. The next morning, Darius declared, "Daniel's God is the living God, and He endures forever" (Daniel 6:26).

In the end, Daniel's integrity silenced his enemies and glorified God. His steady faith not only preserved his life but also transformed the heart of a king and the witness of an empire.

Shaped by Faith, Known by the Spirit

By the time Daniel was an old man, he had served under multiple kings and kingdoms, yet his reputation remained constant. He was known as "a man in whom is the Spirit of the Holy God" (Daniel 4:8). That phrase, spoken even by pagan rulers, reflected what they saw in him: divine wisdom, peace, and integrity that could not be explained by human strength.

Daniel's witness was not built overnight; it was the result of decades of steady faithfulness. The world around him saw something different in him because he lived differently—not arrogantly, but authentically. His humility and consistency made him a light in a dark culture.

At the same time, the challenges and pressures of Babylon shaped Daniel into who he became. His experiences in exile deepened his dependence on God. His encounters with kings, dreams, and decrees stretched his courage. His trials refined his spirit.

In the furnace of cultural opposition, Daniel's faith did not melt—it matured.

The man who entered Babylon as a captive became a statesman and prophet who carried the wisdom of heaven into the halls of earthly power. The culture tried to define him, but God used that very culture to display His Spirit through him.

Daniel's story offers a timeless message for anyone striving to remain faithful amid life's pressures. We, too, live in a world that demands our time, challenges our beliefs, and tempts us toward compromise. But Daniel shows that spiritual steadiness is possible.

It begins with purpose in the heart—a quiet, unwavering decision to honor God daily. It grows through prayer and faithfulness in small things. And it is proven when pressure comes—not by dramatic acts, but by consistent obedience "just as before."

Like Daniel, we are called to be witnesses to the culture around us, not through argument or dominance, but through steadfast faith, humility, and integrity. And just as Daniel's culture shaped him into a vessel of God's Spirit, the challenges of our own world can shape us—if we remain steady—into people through whom others can see that the Spirit of God dwells in us.

THE DESIRE OF ALL NATIONS

"I tell you I see a vision. I see a mighty move of the Holy Ghost in Uganda. A mighty move of the Holy Spirit will begin in Uganda in 2022. Exactly 3 years from today. A mighty, mighty Holy Ghost revival, restoration will come to the nation of Uganda."

(Prophecy given publicly by Benny Hinn in Uganda in 2019. Three years before what you are about to read began.)

"And I will shake all nations, and they shall come to the Desire of All Nations, and I will fill this temple with glory, says the Lord of hosts" Haggai 2:7.

In Psalm chapter two the question is asked, "Why do the nations rage, and the people plot a vain thing"? The Psalm continues describing how, "the kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against His Anointed". To be in a rage refers to being restless, confused, in tumult and in the middle of what could be defined as a rebellious conspiracy that could result in civil war. Yet it's in this context and among circumstances that would cause such targeted rage where the Lord instructs His people to, "Ask of Me, and I will give You the nations for Your inheritance, and the ends of the earth for Your possession". (PS 2:8) From the age of 8 to 20 Annie lived in the streets of Mabarara, Uganda. Most of what she ate she dug out from the garbage dumped along the roads. Every night when possible, she would curl up and fall asleep under a Mango tree. Throughout her childhood and teenage years Annie was used, abused feeling abandoned and hopeless. After hearing stories of what her

parents suffered, she couldn't allow herself to believe God even existed. Then at 20 years of age a Christian couple took her into their home, loved her and led her to Jesus. Years before, Annie's Christian-parents were arrested and imprisoned for praying and worshipping in their home during the reign of terror carried out by General Idi Amin, who became known as the "Butcher of Uganda". Amin was a ruthless dictator who came into power by overthrowing the existing government of Uganda subsequently murdering hundreds of thousands of his own people. Many of them, were Christians. Annie's parents were often beaten during their time in prison, but instead of cursing they prayed for their captors. Miraculously, the guards released Annie's mom and dad after coming under conviction of their own sins and through the influence of the parents ask Jesus to save them!

Upon arriving home Annie's pregnant mother was taken to the hospital where she gave birth to Annie. However, during the delivery, she died from high blood pressure no doubt caused by the trauma from the beatings she received in prison. Years later, Annie heard the Lord tell her to go to the streets to preach Jesus to the children who lived where she had grown up. She immediately and passionately obeyed the Lord until the COVID lockdowns of 2021 that shut everything down throughout the nation. Wanting to see his wife fulfill her God-given mission, Annie's husband offered to pay for radio time so she could still preach to the poor and lost over the radio. Yet soon, due to the lockdowns, Annie's husband lost his job. The radiooutreach, as was the case with the street ministry, were both shut down.

Annie had somehow become acquainted with the online ministry of the Gathering Church in Moravian Falls, NC. While watching, Annie heard the Lord instruct her to ask me, the pastor, to take her radio spot and she would interpret to fulfill what God had called her to do. After receiving the invitation and without knowing anything about Annie, I felt led to pay the required fee for the hour and preach on the radio. But only once! That's been over 4 years ago and after multitudes of Ugandans have called in to Grace Radio 92.6 FM to give their lives to Jesus. In addition to the calls, large online (over zoom), discipleship crusades and pastor's conferences have been held in different regions of Uganda and the bordering nations of Rwanda, Tanzania, Congo and reaching into South Sudan. To date, over 510,000 people have reportedly chosen to follow Jesus that we are aware of. It's as if the Lord used the captivity of COVID to captivate a nation with a freedom they would never lose again.

In addition to the harvest of souls, many have confirmed being healed of various diseases and delivered from demonic oppressions by the power of God. From a 10-year-old boy blind from birth laying his hands on the radio receiving his sight, to a man in his mid-twenties who had been bound under witchcraft and could not walk or talk being completely set free, testimonies poured in of how God is transforming a nation. A testimony came from along the border of Tanzania of 55 witch doctors who listened to the radio crusade and gave their lives to Jesus. Then there was the report of 60 Muslim families who chose to follow Jesus after hearing the testimony of how God saved a former Muslim. One young Muslim boy listened to Grace radio and after receiving Jesus was commanded to leave his home. Not long after the parents listened in and gave their lives to Jesus. They called their son and asked him to come home. Upon arriving they all bowed in their home and pledged to follow Jesus.

From college campuses to prisons and hospitals, many have responded to the convicting power of the gospel. The first discipleship gathering drew over 1000 people. Many who had been saved from praying from the radio ministry. From the very beginning of the meeting, the internet connection was going in and out and at times went completely out. After the meeting I felt as if that could not have accomplished anything. I remember saying how this

venture had to have been a dud. I felt sorry I had wasted the Lord's money. Yet, when the reports came in, the Holy Spirit had fallen upon those gathered proving this move of God was not about any individual, but the fulfillment of what had been prophesied and God had planned. During the years of Idi Amin, the believers would often escape into the mountains to pray and worship in secret. They believed God spoke to them how He would raise up a president who would allow the gospel to be freely preached again. God did exactly that and now a mighty move of the Spirit is sweeping across Uganda and through an internet television ministry into much of Africa. Mostly from an I-Pad on a back porch in North Carolina. In the Old Testament Haggai prophesied of what every individual in every nation is ultimately looking for. Jesus is the Desire of All Nations and He is now drawing men and women of all ages to Himself and to salvation. Nothing, not even the rage and vain plotting of men can stop what God is doing in the hour at hand.





DIVINE ORDER FOR GREATER GLORY

God is a god of order. From the beginning, the record in Genesis 1:2 shows that the world was found "without form" and "void." Strong's concordance defines the phrase "without form" as empty, a wasteland, and a place of chaos. Immediately after that phrase, Scripture records that the Spirit of God hovered over the waters and began to bring order out of the void.

In the natural, when we think about getting our lives in order, it can feel overwhelming and daunting. But the encouragement is that when the Spirit of God initiates it, there is a grace and a freedom in letting go of things that no longer serve us. It is a new season, and what worked in the past season is no longer relevant. We must allow God to give us a paradigm shift and see from His perspective. Sadly, some will prefer to cling to last season's comforts and refuse to submit to Heaven's reordering process. Only those who call themselves the Bride of Christ will recognize the preparation process and willingly submit to it.

During a recent prayer meeting, I heard the Lord say that He is bringing divine order to the Body of Christ for the coming glory that is about to be released on the earth. We all want the greater glory, but it comes with a higher level of consecration and accountability. Many view order and structure as counterintuitive to the move of the Spirit, but the opposite is true. When there is order in His body, and it is yielding to Him, it actually facilitates a greater move of the Spirit.

As we crossed into the new season this fall, many found themselves being uprooted and repositioned into new territory. With that reordering comes a realignment that we must be willing to yield to. It sometimes requires laying down past assignments when it doesn't make sense to our natural minds, but God is preparing us for the greater glory. A greater capacity to carry His presence for greater impact in the nations we are each called to. Part of yielding to His divine order is allowing Him to reposition us. The Lord showed me that many in the Body of Christ are misaligned or dislocated. They are out of place; they have left the place God had positioned them. They have allowed offence to dislodge them. Don't allow anyone or anything to get us out of alignment with Heaven.

When someone enlists in the military, there are various divisions of the armed forces. People in each of the various branches of the military are trained to meet a very specific threat. We must

find our assigned seats and fulfill the role He has designed us for. Then and only then will we reflect His image, His body in the earth as He intends.

What is coming is greater than any of us can imagine. Greater than previous moves of God in the past. The book of Joel speaks of the "former and the latter rains" coming together (Joel 2:23). It will be a tsunami of God's glory flooding the earth. A convergence of rivers coming together until "the knowledge of the glory of the Lord covers the earth, as the waters cover the sea" (Hab. 2:14).

Hear what the Spirit is saying and allow God to reorder your life, realign you, and set you into position. Don't cling to what was familiar in the past season and be a spectator of what God is unleashing in the days ahead. We are living in one of the most crucial times in history, and God chose you and I to be alive – we have a part to play in this end-time plan of God. It is going to be the Church's finest hour!



Do You Believe Him?

The Angel of the LORD had a hard job.

Folks didn't seem to recognize Him when He showed up, which was usually unexpectedly, and He didn't tend to introduce Himself. Now, in the South, that's usually considered bad manners. You're expected to call before you stop by. Why? Well, for one, folks might look a mess as they are lounging around in their housecoat with their hair looking like a possum just died. Or, possibly, they are takin' that long, much anticipated, nap they've been looking forward to for a week and you showin' up with your unannounced banging on the screen door 15 minutes into a sound sleep, can make even a Pastor have to repent for the murderous thoughts going through his head at that moment.

Yet, this was how the Angel of the LORD rolled. He just popped into the messiest of situations in the best human costume ever made and started taking names doin' supernatural stuff. The AOL, as I like to call Him, showed up to 7 people: 6 men and 1 woman. I'm covering two.

Ladies first... Genesis 16:6-16 introduces Mrs. Hagar, the fleeing, pregnant, secondary wife to 86 year old Abram and maid of 76 year old Sarai, who made Hagar marry Abram to give him a son. Because in Sarai's opinion, The LORD wasn't moving fast enough... When Hagar got pregnant, per Sarai's stupid plan, Sarai turned hateful and mistreated Hagar because Sarai felt Hagar despised her and was the more "important" wife... Fellas can we just all agree that having more than one spouse is a bad idea? O.k., o.k. I digress.

Hagar fled from The Abram's (sorry they didn't do last names back then) and, like most pregnant women, needed to rest so she sat down by a stream of water in the wilderness. But she wasn't alone for long... drumroll please for the first mention of The Angel of the LORD! He found her by the stream and said, "Hagar, Sarai's maid, where did you come from, and where are you going?" Now, trust me, He "knew" her exact GPS coordinates were set for Egypt. He knew her name. He knew she was fleeing from Sarai. He also knew this Egyptian Pagan needed Him. Why? He had just made a covenant with Abram that

He would multiply his offspring (even when Hagar was not part of that original plan) and would surely multiply Abram's descendants so that they cannot be counted.. (sounds like sand to me and a GOD who keeps His Word). The AOL continued, "You're pregnant, you'll have a son and you'll call his name Ishmael [God hears] because the LORD has heard and paid attention to your affliction." Hagar believed Him and called the name of the LORD Who spoke to her, "You are a God of Seeing", for she said, "Truly here I have seen Him who looks after me."

Hagar turned around and went back home to the Abram's with no guarantee Sarai would be kind to her. She didn't obey because Abram might love her more than Sarai. She turned around and went back because she had an encounter with the Angel of the LORD who promised He would look after her. He did. Months later, she gave Abram a son. Seems she told Abam Who she met by the stream, and what He said the boy's name would be... How do I know? Gen. 16:15, "Hagar bore Abram a son, and Abram called the name of his son, whom Hagar bore, Ishmael." Hagar's faith in The Angel of the LORD was well rewarded and ours will be too, if we just believe what the LORD promises us.

Alright fellas, it's your turn... The list of Angel of The LORD, eye-witness list, is small but prestigious; Abraham, Moses, Gideon, Jacob, Elijah and Zechariah. I chose Abraham. Gen. 22 - Unbeknownst to Isaac, God has asked Abram, now Abraham, to offer his son who he loves, as a burnt offering on an undisclosed mountain near Mt. Moriah. I would've handled this very differently than Abe. He got up early that morning, saddled his donkey and with two helpers and Isaac, he split the very wood he was being asked to lay his son on for the offering.

I, who am the Mama of just one son myself, would have been up all night beggin' God to change His mind. Reminding Him, how long I waited for my son and I'd probably start accusing Him with, "What kind of God are you? Who asks someone to kill their only son? I would've tried to stall as long as I could in my human strength, then as the sun began to rise, start walking in the direction I think will get me and my boy back home safe and sound and hope God will change His mind on the walk back. Just being honest. After choppin' the wood, the fellas set out for

the "unknown" mountain location... On day three, Abraham looks up, seeing the place in the distance and "knows" this is the place. He stops, tells the two helpers to stay, set up camp with the donkeys, as he and Isaac must go and worship but they'll be back. Interesting... Abraham takes the rope-bound stack of wood meant for the burnt offering and lays it on Isaac, his son. Does this story sound familiar in a New Testament kinda way? It should... Abraham took the fire (firepot), the knife and off they walked together. Moses, who wrote Genesis, doesn't mention God tellin' Abraham where to go but, in Gen, 22:9, Abraham knew where to go. Isaac, who appears to be following his father's footsteps from a short distance, unaware of the fate that awaits him, has a burning question that just won't wait any longer, "Father!", he calls out. "I'm here, my son!" Abraham answers. Isaac states the obvious, "Here's the fire and the wood, but where is the lamb for the burnt sacrifice?" I'm sure the pain in Abraham's heart was palatable. Abraham replied, "My son, God Himself will provide a lamb for the burnt offering." Isaac, content with that answer, continued on the walk with his Father.

When they came to the place God had told him, Abraham built the altar there, laid the wood in order, bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar on top of the wood Isaac had carried on his own back. Abraham took the knife in his hand and raised it in the air to slaughter his son....

But.

But what? But wait!!

The Angel of The LORD called to Abraham from Heaven, shouting his name loud and clear... Abraham! Abraham! He looked around seeing no one and answered, "Here I am!" The Angel of The LORD told him, "Don't lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him; for now I know you fear and revere God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me. Abrahan looked up and around him and behold, behind him was a ram caught in a thicket by his horns. He went over, took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering in place of his son. Abraham named the place, "The LORD will provide."

As if that wasn't enough, the Angel of The LORD had more to say, "I have sworn by Myself, (I love it when He does that!) says the LORD, that since you went through with this and didn't withhold giving Me your son, your only son, in blessing I will bless you and in multiplying, I will multiply your descendants like the stars of the heavens and like the sand on the seashore. And your Seed (Heir) will possess the gate of His enemies." Notice the capital "S" in Seed. He's talking about Himself in the future as Jesus, the Messiah! "And in your Seed (Christ) will all the nations of the earth be blessed and [by Him] bless themselves, because you have heard and obeyed My voice.

What's the repeat theme that Hagar and Abraham both lived through? The Angel of The LORD spoke and they believed Him and did what He said. Brothers and Sisters we are in the last days. The Angel of The LORD in the Old Testament is the Messiah, and Lord Jesus Christ of the New Testament. He reigns as King and Lord sitting at the right hand of His Father because God sent Him to be the sacrifice for you and me with a wooden cross He had to carry to

his own slaughter.

When He speaks,

1. Listen

Whatever He tells you to do,

- 2. Believe that what He says is always true and will come to pass. He never lies.
- 3. Move forward in faith, trusting Him no matter how things look in the natural.

There was no ram in the thicket when Abraham arrived at the location God selected. The ram wasn't provided till Abraham lifted his knife high in the air to thrust his blade full force into the heart of his son Isaac. That's the kind of faith and obedience we must have in our LORD. If He says it, believe Him and watch the glory of heaven fall.

Focus

I recently read an article I thought was fascinating both in wisdom and simplicity regarding priorities. The article was about Warren Buffet and his "Rule of 25". The "Rule of 25" exercise has a person list out the top 25 goals they believe is important for them to do. After listing these 25 items, the next step is to identify the 5 goals that are the most important. Once these 5 are identified, cross out the other 20. They are distractions.

I worked as a bank examiner for the US Treasury Department for the last 28 years and during my time there we had several presidential appointed heads of our agency. What I noticed in most of them, is they all had a strategically determined set of agenda items they focused on. Each appointed agency head had a five year term before leaving the agency for another prestigious position. Given their limited term, the size of the agency (approximately 4,000 employees), and the impact on the nation's financial infrastructure (we oversaw more than 65% of U.S. commercial assets), focus on right messaging and efficiency in executing strategic objectives was critical. What I observed in effective leaders of our agency, and within the banks I examined was impactful leaders had an ability to focus on the most critical elements of their organization. The leader's focus helped everyone on the team understood the primary mission, channeled their energy to achieve the primary organization goals, and day to day tasks became a contributor to achieving higher strategic objectives

rather than a meaningless task.

Our CEO (Jesus) gave the over-riding organizational goals for his disciples in the Great Commission. "All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." In this mission statement, Jesus boiled down for us "our top goals".

- 1. You go that means you, that means me, that means every disciple of Jesus. We all have somewhere, someone, something to go to.
- 2. Teach all nations we are to instruct those we are familiar with and those we have yet to encounter whether that's in our nation or outside. Clearly God is interested in having sons and daughter from all ethnicities His house wouldn't be complete without them.
- 3. Baptize them in the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost you carry an anointing that represents the kingdom of Heaven. You are a holy priesthood, a royal ambassador and the King has granted you authority to invite and extend that anointing to others. All who are made part of this family are baptized with the holy fire of the spirit and washed by the blood of the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of those who receive Him.

4. Teach them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you – we have a message given from the lips of the one who holds all power and authority in heaven and earth. His message is one of life because what He spoke was spirit and life. Feed on those words and breathe them out to wherever He sends you.

The church has not completed the great commission yet...which is why we are still here. God's kingdom is great and greatly to be expanded. If we focus on the mission statement we'll fulfill our CEO's vision and results will come.



The harvest is here and the church needs to quickly respond.

John 4:35 "Do you not say, 'There are still four months and [then] comes the harvest'? Behold, I say to you, lift up your eyes and look at the fields, for they are already white for harvest!"

Jesus commanded us to go into all the world and make disciples. Yet for far too long, much of the modern church has changed this commandment into, "go and make converts."

Salvation and being born again are vital, foundational steps – but, they are only the beginning. New believers must be trained and equipped to fulfill their

calling as disciples living in the Kingdom of God. Mat 28:18-20 18 And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. 19 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, 20 teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

I recently had the opportunity to teach a class in Kazakhstan on discipleship. As I worked through translating my slides for the teaching, I noticed that the Russian word for disciple is also translated as apprentice. I was amazed by how succinctly this sums up what it means to make disciples.

Discipleship involves teaching, yes – but that is only part of the job. Discipleship also requires releasing, encouraging and evaluating the disciple's performance as they start applying their knowledge in real life.

For too long, we have relied solely on Pastors – the "professionals" – to train new believers. But true discipleship requires personal relationship and active engagement. At its core, it is built on the relationship between teacher and student, master and apprentice. This is Jesus' great commission to each of us. Every believer is called to make disciples – to help raise the next generation of Christ-followers.

Jesus said that a student should become like his master.

Mat 10:24-25 24 "A disciple is not above his teacher, nor a slave above his master. 25 "It is enough for the disciple that he become like his teacher, and the slave

like his master. If they have called the head of the house Beelzebul, how much more [will they malign] the members of his household!

Luke 6:40 "A pupil is not above his teacher; but everyone, after he has been fully trained, will be like his teacher.

The Apostle Paul reinforced that point when he said, "Be imitators of me, just as I also am of Christ" (1 Corinthians 11:1).

Imitating Christ is a noble goal, but is only a beginning. Jesus also said that those who believe in Him would do the works He did—and even greater works. John 14:12 "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater [works] than these he will do, because I go to My Father."

If we look honestly at the church today, we must admit that we fall far short of this standard. One of the greatest lies that we have allowed into the church – and the greatest theft that we have tolerated – is to look at the things that Jesus did and say, "But that was Jesus." We have institutionalized the deception that we cannot do the things that Jesus did, in direct

contradiction to what He said.

There is a story that John Wimber shared about his early days as a new believer. He was attending a mainline denomination church in his neighborhood. After a traditional Sunday morning service, he spoke with the pastor and said, "Okay, when do we do it?"

The pastor looked at him with confusion and asked, "Do what?"

John replied, "When do we do the miracles? When do we do the power things?"

The pastor's response was simple, "We don't do those things."

Unfortunately, this reply does not align with scripture.

1 Corinthians 4:20 For the Kingdom of God is not in words, but in power.

Paul also warned of a time when there will be people, "having a form of godliness but denying its power." He tells Timothy, "And from such people turn away!" (2 Timothy 3:5)

Today, many churches are known for eloquent, entertaining speakers, moving worship, and polished

production. But for too many, they are not known as places of power.

We can no longer be satisfied with the form of religion while denying its power. We must pursue the power of God with all our hearts, souls, and minds. 1 Corinthians 14:1 Pursue love, yet desire earnestly spiritual [gifts,] but especially that you may prophesy. The phrase desire earnestly in the Greek conveys more than simple longing—it means to pursue passionately, to be driven by an overwhelming desire to operate in the supernatural realm. We should passionately seek the power of miracles, healing, prophecy, and the wisdom and knowledge of God.

In Revelation 3, Jesus rebuked the church in Laodicea:

"Because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth." (Revelation 3:16) He went on to expose their deception:

"Because you say, 'I am rich, and have become wealthy, and have need of nothing,' and you do not know that you are wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked." (Revelation 3:17)

It's time for a wake-up call. It's time to break free from deception and compromise. It's time to step into our inheritance as believers—a new creation born into a Kingdom without limits.

But walking in this Kingdom also requires obedience and humility. We must learn to follow the Spirit carefully, avoiding the traps of assumption and presumption.

In many ways, the Church has lost its focus. We have become so salvation-centered that we have lost our vision of the Kingdom of God.

The good news of Jesus Christ is not merely that our sins are forgiven—it is that the Kingdom of God has come near. When we fail to pursue that Kingdom, we miss the fullness of God's blessing, purpose, and power.

Jesus said He came so that we might have life, and have it abundantly (John 10:10). That abundant life is a Kingdom lifestyle—living as children of the Lord God Almighty. It is a life where we can speak to mountains and expect them to move, where we walk in the same power and authority that Jesus demonstrated.

Now is the time to draw near to the Lord. God desires to be with us so deeply that He sent the Holy Spirit to dwell within us—to be present every moment of every day.

He is with us in every trial, every challenge, and every victory. We must learn to live in continual fellowship with Him—not only seeking Him in crisis, but walking with Him daily, hourly, every moment. He is ready to manifest His power through us at any time.

It's time to put down unbelief. It's time to break free from the burdens and limitations the enemy has placed upon us.

Jesus said that the enemy comes to steal, kill, and destroy—but He came that we might have life. The enemy has stolen too much for too long. Today, it is time to rise up and declare, "There is more, and I will walk in it."

As we learn to live in His Kingdom, it is also time to disciple this great harvest—to teach new believers how to walk in that same Kingdom power.



KAZAKHSTAN MINISTRY UPDATE

It all began on a Monday morning in the fall of 2021. While sitting on my deck spending time with the Lord, I received a text message from my friend, Dr. Jorge Parrott, President of Christ's Mandate for Missions (CMM). He asked if I could teach a class on Discerning of Spirits for a group in Kazakhstan that Wednesday morning. He mentioned the class would last two hours, including time for translation and a question-and-answer session at the end.

My immediate thought was, "I need to attend that class, not teach it!" I felt completely unqualified—and with less than two days to prepare, I couldn't imagine developing a teaching on the subject. I was about to reply, saying I didn't feel qualified, when I heard the Lord speak:

"If you can't trust Me enough to give you what you need to teach this class, can you at least trust that Jorge heard Me when I told him to ask you?" I paused and humbly admitted, "Yes, Lord, I can believe that." So I responded to Jorge, saying I would be glad to teach. I had no idea that this simple act of obedience—though hesitant at first—would change my life forever.

For the next day and a half, I spent nearly all my time on the deck praying and asking the Lord for wisdom about what to say. As I waited, He began showing me insights about the Holy Spirit and how He operates in our lives. I wrote everything down in my journal. By Tuesday afternoon, I realized that if I reorganized my notes, I already had an outline. It was unlike any teaching I had ever heard about the Holy Spirit and the gift of discerning spirits—more like an extended prophetic message than a structured lesson. When Wednesday arrived, the class went well. I

finished with about thirty minutes left for questions and answers. That session lasted an hour and a half, and people still had their hands raised when we finally stopped—for fear of exhausting our interpreter! It was an exhilarating experience to be received so warmly.

A few days later, Jorge texted again. The group in Kazakhstan had more questions—could I spend another two hours with them? I agreed, and we met the following week. Once again, the meeting lasted three hours, and the participants still wanted more. Not long after, Jorge reached out with another request. This time, some of the people wanted personal prophetic ministry. He asked if I could join a ministry team. I had done this before with the CMM Skype teams and quickly agreed. The following week, we spent more than two hours ministering to a group of people—it was a powerful and moving time. Soon after, I received yet another message—this time asking if I could organize and lead a prophetic ministry team for Kazakhstan. And with that, my involvement in the region changed forever.

That was four years ago. Since then, our team has ministered to more than 500 people in Russian-speaking churches across Kazakhstan, Russia, Uzbekistan, Germany, Ukraine, and Slovakia. In 2025 alone, we've ministered to over 150 individuals. One of the most meaningful aspects of our prophetic ministry can be seen in the feedback we've received. In the late 1990s and early 2000s, a prophetic movement began in Kazakhstan. Unfortunately, many were hurt, and churches were divided by immature prophets who modeled their ministry after Old Testament prophets—bringing judgment and condem-

nation instead of life. The damage was so great that many church leaders rejected prophetic ministry altogether.

When our team came, we ministered out of God's love, seeking to encourage and strengthen each person. We've been told that our ministry helped release a new understanding of what true prophetic ministry looks like.

Another exciting development this year is that graduates from a prophetic school in Kazakhstan have begun serving as members of our team. It's incredible to see how the Lord weaves people together from around the world—people who don't even speak the same language—yet flow in unity as if they've ministered together for years!

But prophetic ministry is just the beginning of what the Lord is doing in Kazakhstan and Central Asia. In early 2022, a church in Karaganda, one of Kazakhstan's largest cities, asked us to provide monthly teachings on how the Holy Spirit operates in the life of a believer. Those meetings continue to this day, now more like interactive workshops where everyone participates in ministry and grows in their gifts. In June 2024, we hosted our first Prophetic Roundtable for Kazakhstan and Central Asia via Zoom. Pastors and leaders from across the region attended, and hundreds more have since watched the recording on YouTube.

In May 2025, the Lord opened a new door for ministry when we held our first three-day Zoom conference, Pastoring the Prophetic. Nearly one hundred people attended online, including one church that

streamed the sessions in their sanctuary. The recordings have since been viewed hundreds of times. Later that year, we were invited to minister prophetically to the nation of Kazakhstan as part of a panel at a large prophetic conference hosted by a local church. Most recently, we were asked to teach a group in Almaty—one of Kazakhstan's largest southern cities—about prophetic ministry and the operation of the Holy Spirit. It's amazing to see how hungry these people are for more of the Lord.

As you can see, the past four years have been an incredible journey. Yet I believe we've only seen the tip of the iceberg of what the Lord has planned. We're now connected with the largest association of Spirit-filled churches in Kazakhstan, and there are ongoing discussions about ministering to churches within their network. We've also been contacted by national leaders in Slovakia and by churches in Russia who want us to teach and minister there as well. In 2024, someone reminded me of Bob Jones' prophecy about the billion-soul harvest. In an interview, Bob said the Lord showed him that: The harvest would be led by young people.

It would come out of Russia.

Once they embraced the Gifts of the Spirit, they would be unstoppable.

After reading that, I heard the Lord say, "Kazakhstan is the gateway to Russia and to releasing this great harvest." It was one of the most humbling moments

of my life. I suddenly saw my small part in this great move of God—not as a key figure, but as one of many workers with a role to play.

This ministry has been one of the greatest blessings of my life. Five years ago, I could never have imagined being part of something like this. Today, I can't imagine my life without it.

A few final thoughts:

I am currently 77 years old. This ministry began when I was 73. It's never too late to get involved in God's work and help build His Kingdom on earth. As Rick Joyner often says, we should focus on refirement, not retirement. This ministry has truly "refired" my life—and I believe there are countless opportunities for others to do the same.

I conduct all of this ministry via Zoom from my home office in rural central North Carolina. A friend of mine reaches hundreds of thousands in Uganda from his back porch in the North Carolina mountains. With today's technology, you don't need to travel the world to change it.

I don't speak Russian (yet!), and I've never traveled to Kazakhstan. But the Lord has raised up a faithful team of volunteers there who dedicate countless hours scheduling ministry sessions and translating everything into Russian to make this work possible.

The Lord has also brought together an amazing team from the Carolinas, Louisiana, Pennsylvania, Kansas, and even Sardinia—people willing to give their time and talents to minister to those on "the other side of the world."

This is truly the Lord's work. He created the opportunities and built the team. My part was simply to say yes. And there are many other opportunities waiting for someone else to say yes.

SEED REVOLUTION

The Tuesday of October 14, 2025 was a breakthrough day for me after 21 months of contending for healing my liver. I was sick for a few years and getting worse. I went through many lab tests, sometimes weekly. I took many pills, and was perplexed not to see any improvement and even worse sometimes. Finally on Tuesday, I got the fulfillment of many prophetic words of my healing. Tuesday is the auspicious, or doubly-blessed day for Jewish people, and many Jewish couples choose to get married on that day. They explain that the book of Genesis said, "God saw that it was good," twice on the third day of creation which is Tuesday. God created life as He made vegetations, plants and trees with seeds.

Nations Cry for Revolution

The world 2025 is unlike the one I have lived in over 35 years. Many people, both Christians and non-Christians, are calling for change for different reasons. Personally, I do not enjoy the rise of anti-semitism, terrorisms including assassination of Charlie Kirk, massive illegal migration to the west by people who claim to erase the existing cultures, indoctrination of the children to anti-biblical ways, persecution against Christians, and tyranny to take away our foundational freedom. The rising multitudes of people are pushing back the darkness in every nation.

History shows hate against hate never solved a problem, and even accelerated it. As all those problems are rooted in the spiritual realm, the solutions must come from the spiritual realm. We cry for the holy spiritual revolution. God already gives us the seeds to bring His kingdom on the earth.

The Seed is Strong

We know that genetics has an influence on physical traits like skin, eye and hair color, height, body shape, and athletic potential. The ACTN3 gene influences fast-twitch muscle fibers linked to sprinting ability, muscle power and hand-grip strength. As a physician, I see genetics has an influence on health risks like heart disease, diabetes, cancer, Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, and gluten sensitivity. Genetics has an influence also on mental health like depression, bipolar disease, ADHD, and autism. Genetics also has an influence on taste, smell, hearing, and vision sensitivities. Interestingly, genetics influences behavior and personality like temperament of shyness or extroversion, risk-taking or impulsivity, cognitive traits like memory, attention, and decision-making. We can see the seed (genetics) is strong around us. Good genetic inheritances satisfy our feelings but negative ones try to shake us down.

But Definitely Not the End from the Beginning

I was a shy child but later grew into a confident leader. I choose to overcome shyness whenever I face it. My wife is a music teacher at an American school in Myanmar. She always performs in classes and sometimes at large events with hundreds of kids, parents, teachers and professionals. That doesn't mean she never struggles with shyness. Our shy trait is recessive as the nature of confidence dominates it. Our two-year-old son Justin wasn't shy as he grew up. We registered him for a weekly music class. He was doing well for the first few months. He tried to greet and socialize with two of his classmates who are also between two and five years.. Those two cute kids do not know how to respond to Justin. They totally ignore Justin's outgoing socializing behavior. Then, we noticed Justin became shy in the classroom. Please understand that I am not blaming the kids. Justin has a shy recessive trait which he got from both of us. That doesn't automatically cause genetic expression of shyness. The environmental factors are trying to reinforce the shy trait. Some children are born with temperamental traits like behavioral inhibition or social sensitivity. These traits make the child have a natural tendency to be more cautious, reserved, or shy in new situations. Please know that such genetic predispositions are definitely not the end determined from the beginning. A child can change, grow, and thrive even if they have a biological tendency toward shyness. Safe exposure to new situations, modeling confidence, words of affirmation and social skills coaching can help the child and change one's life.

Spiritual Principles of Epigenetics

Joseph is a descendant of Jeconiah in the genealogy of Jesus. Jeremiah prophesied a curse on Jeconiah that none of his offspring shall succeed in sitting on the throne of David (Jer. 22:30). Mary is also a descendant of David, not by Jeconiah's bloodline. That's why Jesus is called the seed of the woman. Redemption is greater than brokenness.

Negative genetic inheritance may be discomforting to our hearts but God has His spiritual principles of epigenetics for the seeds we carry. We know that the human reasoning of Joseph for secret divorce was overridden by a supernatural dream too. Whether good or bad, we have both dominant and recessive genes in our DNA. Dominant ones being turned on or expressed. Recessive ones are suppressed. Epigenetics is the study of changes in gene expression that do not involve changes to the DNA sequence itself. It changes how genes are turned on or off. There was a classic science experiment on epigenetics at the end of the 20th century. Pregnant yellow mice were fed a diet rich in methyl donors (like folic acid, B vitamins, and choline), the babies were more likely to be brown and healthy. The opposite was done on the other pregnant mice, and the babies were more likely to be yellow and susceptible to the development of diseases such as obesity, diabetes or certain cancers. The mother's diet influenced the epigenetic marks (methylation) on the offspring's agouti gene. Environmental factors, nutrition, stress, aging, gut bacteria and medicines have positive and

negative impacts on our genes.

God wants to focus on who we are and what we are doing in this hour instead of being carried away by the anxious thoughts about global shaking. Seed (Hebrew "Zera" and Greek "Sperma") is the powerful spiritual weapon operating in three ways.

The Blood of the Lamb

Naturally, the seed speaks of our genetics and offsprings. We must be gracefully taking care of what we breathe, eat, fast, contact, and how we exercise, spend time in nature, connect healthy relationships, sleep and learn. We must raise our children on godly foundations. This is how we work out epigenetics in the natural realm. In the spiritual realm, Galatians 3:16 and John 12:14 talked about Christ as the seed of promise that brings life. As we receive Christ, we

have the seed of God in us according to 1st John 3:9. We ourselves become Abraham's seed of generational blessings according to Galatians 3:29.

This is beyond natural epigenetics. Life is in the blood. The sinners and the land were cursed. As the repentant sinners and the land receive the blood of the Lamb, this transforms everything. I have seen cancer patients healed through our ministries. I have seen my mom miraculously healed. The blood of the Lamb rules. The seed of God in us changes the stories. The enemy is defeated by the blood of the Lamb. As you take communion, you are receiving the body and the blood of the Lamb. This supernatural epigenetics is the seed revolution.

The Word of Our Testimony

The word of God is the imperishable seed according to Luke 8:11 and 1st Peter 1:23. Testimony is a witness account. We have the mandate to receive the generational testimony of the truth of God by faith in our heart, experience and walk in that reality, and pass down to our children. What we say determines our destiny and of nations. We are commanded to choose the ancient path of the Lord as our roadmap. We are not to lie and change the testimony. Doubts and human reasoning are all overridden

by God's supernatural interventions. We defeat the enemy by the word of our testimony.

The Resilient Valor

The kingdom of God, with its mysteries like resurrection and its principles like giving, is the seed according to Mark 4:26-31, 1st Corinthians 15:36-38 and 2nd Corinthians 9:10. The power of the Holy Spirit is released by our faith. Faith is sometimes instant, and sometimes demands perseverance. I used to tell myself, "I will not write a sad story. I will write a glory-story." I am healed after 21 months of resilient journey. Daniel had a spiritual breakthrough after 21 days. We defeat our enemy by our resilient valor that we loved not our lives even unto death. Our Prophetic Revolution Ministries has a motto, "Truth, Loyalty and Valor."

'And they have conquered him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, for they loved not their lives even unto death.' (Revelation 12:11 ESV)

Nations are groaning. We carry the blood, the testimony and the valor in you. Let us wage the seed revolution together, and shape the nations.

Positioned For Dynamic Prophetic Ministry

Our Father is now revealing His dynamic power through the prophetic ministry. The Lord desires us to prophesy to others as His messengers of fire. Personal prophetic words are capable of releasing life and transformation into the receiver's heart. The purpose of the gift of prophecy is far more than words of encouragement or confirmation. We have the opportunity to prophesy words that bring forth the power of eternal life, healing, and liberty into the hearts and minds of the hearers. To do this we must minister prophetically from our position in Christ.

The Lord desires that we prophesy words filled with transformative power as we release His authority to impact the hearts, minds and bodies of others. Jesus declared His words are spirit and life (Jn 6:63). As He speaks through us, personal prophetic ministry goes beyond words of knowledge, encouragement, and confirmation. These types of words are essential, and we must not neglect them. Yet it is time to believe the Holy Spirit will minister through us with higher levels of authority.

The Lord is drawing us into greater intimacy which enables us to minister with His words of creative power. These words bring forth life and transformation. As we prophesy, we have the opportunity to release words that set captives free, heal souls and ignite hearts with Christ's passion and power. This occurs through the life-giving power of the Holy Spirit, who is the Spirit of Christ within us. He yearns to release His transformative words through us to

manifest the testimony of Jesus in the lives of others (Rev 19:10).

Three essential keys empower us to minister personal prophecies with the transformative power of the Spirit. First, we must intentionally pursue a closer relationship with the Lord. Second, we must believe He desires us to prophesy His words of life that release healing power and set captives free. Third, it is essential we learn to minister from our position in Christ as one with Him.

Intentional Pursuit of the Lord

Jesus promises His disciples that they will receive power from the Spirit when He comes upon them. This was initially fulfilled in the upper room on the Day of Pentecost as 120 of His followers spoke in other languages to the international crowd. The hearers of this phenomenon were Jews who traveled to Jerusalem from many nations to celebrate the Feast. The disciples unknowingly declared the Gospel of Jesus Christ in their languages. As a result, 3,000 were saved. Their hearts experienced transformation through the prophetic messages released by the Spirit. In this way, those in the upper room were the first to prophesy the Gospel message by the power of the Spirit after the resurrection.

The gift of prophecy declares the testimony of the Gospel of Christ. It is expressed through believers in various ways. The servant of the Lord explains the testimony of Jesus is the Spirit of prophecy as he discloses things to come to John the Revelator (Rev 19:10). Holy Spirit reveals Christ's resurrection life and power to transform hearts and minds through prophesy. This is one way He manifests power to deliver the captives and heal those who are sick. The Spirit also shares through prophetic words God's unfailing love, His plans of good and not evil, as well as the secrets of darkness.

The miracle of Pentecost was poured out upon 120 believers who intentionally pursued the Lord. These men and women demonstrated their passion for Christ as they earnestly prayed for ten days seeking the outpouring of His Spirit. They had already been born of the Spirit as Jesus breathed His Spirit on them (Jn 20:22). Yet their hearts hungered to know and experience Him in His resurrection life and power.

We have the opportunity to live every day in awe of the Lord if we intentionally seek a close relationship with Him intimately. To know Christ in His fullness is to be our daily pursuit and eternal goal. There are no bounds to knowing Him and experiencing life as one with Him. Nothing is more important than knowing the wonders of the unlimited King of Glory. To enjoy the Lord every day is the greatest blessing anyone can have. When we pursue His presence, we experience His immeasurable love, His joy, and His peace that surpasses all understanding. There is no better life!

Heart-felt Faith

The challenge of faith is often rooted in a lack of understanding of the transformation that occurs when we are born again. With our natural eyes we see that we continue to live in our earthly bodies. We realize we have changed because suddenly we know Jesus Christ is Lord. We desire to know Him more and please Him. Now we must believe that our spirit has been transformed. We are truly united as one with Christ.

The moment we are born again Holy Spirit indwells us and we are brought to live inside Christ. Our spirits are instantaneously joined with Him as one. We live in Christ and He lives in us (Rom 6:11; 1 Cor 6:17). We literally become a new creation in Christ (1 Cor 5:17). Our life is in Him, now and forever.

This truth of our union with Christ must be within our hearts, not just in our minds. We need to believe the Savior, who is the Creator, has joined us as one with Himself. This is faith that is beyond faith for salvation. It is believing that we are truly united as one with the Almighty. Through this union, Christ now lives His life on earth through us. One of the greatest tragedies of our times is the many who are lured, then trapped in sexual slavery. Reports show there are more people in slavery worldwide than at any time in history. The CMM Global Family prays for and helps free slaves through our trusted, indigenous network of long-term fruitful friends/missionaries. This year with more nations in conflict amidst the lockdowns due to the pandemic we have freed more slaves than ever before in CMM's history.

Thank you for your prayers and generosity in helping provide freedom, safety, hope, restoration, and renewal of hope to many women, men, and children who were freed from the terror of sex slavery. Many we have freed are teenagers sold in the sex trade. Imagine the horror at a young age or any age of being treated so viciously! Some do not survive but for those who do we pray and work diligently to see them healed of all trauma so they may fulfill all the Lord created them for. Often, the Lord gives a special mantle for healing others to those who have suffered in one particular area of suffering in their own life to bring healing to others afflicted in a similar way.

CMM has gathered friends who are graduates of our CMM College of Theology to form a Trauma Triage Team to comfort and counsel these victims. Freeing the slaves is only the beginning of the process of restoration leading to fullness in their lives. Please

remember this healing process is a long road and we ask you to pray about sending monthly support for their healthcare, food, clothing, education and eventual vocational training so they may become self-sustaining.

We have seen radically different results in the USA depending on the current administration in power. We can not relent in applying pressure through legal means by increasing awareness and reaching out to the afflicted. CMM has several effective and fruitful teams in various regions of the US focused on aid, rescue and restoration of trafficked victims to free them and shelter them into wholeness and restoration.

We have many in nations globally who also focus on this and they covet your prayers and financial support to save lives and bring healing and recovery from this horrific trauma. We also work to free debt slaves trapped into working in horrid conditions and squalor at slave wages, unable to ever get free on their own.

CMM also has free, wholesome preventive education in

partnership with Born2Fly.org offering free youth and young adult training in 15 languages to educate young people how to avoid the pitfalls of sexual slavery. From the president:

"Human trafficking is a modern form of slavery. It is not enough merely to denounce this horrific assault on human dignity; we must actively work to prevent and end this barbaric exploitation of innocent victims. During National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month, we pledge to continue the battle to abolish modern slavery and restore the lives of those affected by human trafficking."

CMM Partners Have Prayed, Gave, and Bought Families Out of Slavery

CMM has freed many families from slavery. Thank you CMM Partners for praying and giving generously to free several whole families from slavery in brick kiln factories and slaves freed from the sex trade.

One of our long-term CMM members and friend, Tahir in Pakistan keeps us updated regularly on all that is happening in his region.

One family's ordeal: A precious 4-year-old girl fell into a brick kiln and was burned over 60% of her body. The slave owner who also owns the brick factory would not even let the parents take her to a doctor or hospital! Pastor Tahir acted fast and contacted CMM and we quickly let our intercessors and friends pray and help. Within days the price was paid to buy the whole family out of slavery so the precious little girl could get much-needed medical care. She and her family are now safely in a Christian compound recovering from terrible trauma. This is just one example of the horrors of slavery

the Lord has used the CMM Global Family to bring hope and restoration and recovery from evil trauma, for His glory!

Tahir and his teams have rescued over 500 refugees fleeing Afghanistan and CMM Partners have faithfully sowed generously into this along with rescuing slaves from the sex trade. Tahir thanks all the CMM family for praying and rescuing several whole families who were slaves in the brick kiln factories.

Through your help and prayers, we paid all the money owed to buy these whole families and free them. They are all safely in our ministry compounds and safe houses receiving the love of God, hope, and restoration. The muslim owner had to sign official government papers and put his thumbprint on it to make it valid so that he cannot chase them or come back later and say they did not pay. Our prayers and plans are to free more slaves as the Lord leads and provides. If you want to be a part of this precious outreach and free more slaves or help in their restoration please contact our office. We are also buying sewing machines regularly to help these former slaves learn skills and a trade to be self-sustaining as the Lord heals the broken-hearted. Jesus came to set the captives free and YOU can be a vital part in this process.

WHY WE GIVE

(All verses are from NKJV)

Heaven's windows are now open. Now is the time of enormous harvest, when the light of the Lord's brightness dispels all the shadows and foils all the schemes of our spiritual enemy. Mass satanic deception persists. We must get ready for the next natural or man-made catastrophe. As disciples of Jesus, we hold on to the Word and Psalm 91 during every global adversity. To access God's gifts and abundance in both good and difficult times, let's take a brief look at what the Bible says about giving to the needy and how we rise above the fray and prosper, even as our souls prosper.

Jesus came to earth to destroy the works of the devil, not to take your money and give it to people who don't have any. "To undo the devil's work, the Son of God came to earth for this exact purpose." NKJV 1 John 3:8

Luke 12:15 Observe caution and guard against every form of covetousness. The man asked Jesus to take something from his brother and give it to him, but Jesus did not have anything. Both the rich and the poor can struggle with covetousness, and Jesus forbids us from doing so. Proverbs 23:4 states, "Do not overwork to be rich; Because of your own understanding, cease!" Greed and materialism are synonyms for covetousness.

While Jerusalem was under siege, Jeremiah foretold in Jeremiah 6:13, "Because everyone is given to covetousness, from the least to the greatest; and everyone deals falsely, from the prophet to the priest." Greed and covetousness are natural desires of the flesh, and we must constantly die to the flesh.

Next, "because a person's life is not defined by the

quantity of things they own." Given that Christians are citizens of this world, this can be a major issue for the church. When someone has a lot of stuff, the public views them as successful. God examines one's heart. "Yet, since they are all the products of His hands, He is not partial to princes or considers the wealthy to be more important than the impoverished." 34:19 in Job.

There is no distinction between rich and poor in Christ; we are all the same, regardless of our financial situation. As the Bible states, the source of all evil is the love of money. It is evident that the Bible, from the time of the Law of Moses to the arrival of Jesus, commands us to give to the impoverished. Verse 24:19 "To the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow, that the Lord, your God, may bless you in all that you do with your hands, when you reap your harvest in your field and forget a sheaf in the field, you shall not go back to get it."

Matthew 25:41–43 Afterwards, He will further address those on the left, saying, "Depart from Me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels: 42 for I was hungry and you did not give Me food; 43 I was a stranger and you did not take Me in; 44 I was sick and in prison and you did not visit Me."

YEAR-END GIVING

Your charitable income tax deductions are one of the few tax planning opportunities completely within your control. The amount and timing of your gifts are all up to you. By carefully planning, your charitable gifts—and completing them by December 31—you may enjoy the satisfaction of giving while increasing your tax refund or reducing taxes you would otherwise owe next April. What Should You Give?

- Cash: Charitable gifts are most often made in the form of cash and checks. If you itemize your tax deductions, gifts of cash can eliminate or reduce tax on up to one-half of your adjusted gross income (AGI).*Be sure to maintain receipts, acknowledgments, or bank records related to your gifts.
- Securities: Making gifts of stocks, bonds, and/or mutual funds can bring extra tax savings. When making such gifts, always consider what the securities originally cost in relation to what they are worth today. When securities have increased in value, you should normally give them directly rather than sell them and give from the proceeds. When owned for more than a year, securities used to fund a gift can be tax-deductible at full fair market value, not just their original cost. Giving in this way also enables you to bypass capital gains tax that would otherwise be due if the donated securities were sold Gifts of securities are deductible in amounts up to 30% of AGI. If you own securities that have decreased in value since you have owned them, consider selling those securities and making a charitable gift of all or a portion of the cash proceeds. In addition to an income tax deduction for the cash contribution, this creates a loss you may be able to deduct from other taxable income.
- Retirement Accounts: This year, if you are over the age of 70 1/2, it is possible to make tax-free charitable gifts directly from your IRA. Giving in this way assures that these funds, whether or not you are required to withdraw them, will never be subject to income or estate tax, this may make it possible to give more at the same or lower cost than in the past. Check with your IRA administrator for more details regarding the amount and timing of such gifts.

- Other Assets: You may own real estate or certain other properties that could also be good choices for charitable gifts. Whether you make your gifts in the form of cash or other property, charitable gifts may serve to reduce your taxes not only for this year, but for as many as five future years as well. Your financial services provider can furnish you with additional information and the forms necessary to complete your gifts in a timely and tax-efficient way. Looking to the future as a result of changes in the tax law, most Americans find they can now leave more to loved ones and/or their charitable interests free of federal estate and gift taxes. As you review your plans for the future, you may wish to consider the following alternatives:
- Gifts that feature income for you or others: A number of methods exist that allow, you to make charitable gifts while providing generous payments for you and/or others, along with current and future tax savings and other financial benefits.
- A gift through your will or living trust: After providing for loved ones, you can direct that a specific amount, a percentage certain property, or all or a portion of what remains in your estate be devoted to charitable use, there is no limit to the amount of charitable gifts that are deductible for gifts and estate tax purposes.
- Retirement plan accounts can be subject to both income and estate taxes, relatively little of these funds may be left for heirs. That is one reason it can be wise to make gifts following your lifetime from retirement funds. As noted earlier, retirement accounts may also be a good choice when deciding how to make current gifts as well.
- Life insurance policies that have built up cash value but are no longer needed for their original purposes can make excellent charitable gifts. You may also find that including a charitable beneficiary for all or part of the proceeds of a life insurance policy can be a convenient way to provide a gift through your estate.
